# a) Minutes of the meeting held on 4th October 2021

Councillor H Unwin presented the Minutes of the meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> October 2021, for information.

#### b) Recommendations

- i) It was proposed by Councillor H Unwin and seconded by Councillor Wust that a revised budget be agreed which would include £82,000 as earmarked reserves in accordance with the original budget for 2021/22 which had been agreed prior to Covid.
- ii) It was proposed by Councillor H Unwin and seconded by Councillor Holt that Hollinswood & Randlay Parish Council adopts the revised and updated Code of Conduct. A summary document has been produced. These will appear on the website.
- iii) It was proposed by Councillor Unwin and seconded by Councillor Creed that the Parish Council awards the Waste Removal Contract to Cartwrights of Telford for a two year period. Members were pleased to support this recommendation as this is a local company, with a zero to landfill policy.

### e) Grant Application

Members had received details of the application from AGE UK Shropshire Telford & Wrekin which requested funding towards their Covid Recovery Appeal. The Parish Council has already agreed to provide a free venue for the Day Centre at Hollinswood Neighbourhood Centre until Christmas and also to fund the cost of transport for those attending. It was

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therefore agreed that no decision would be taken at this time and that we would respond to remind them of our commitment to support the Friday event and that the Parish Council will consider a future application for a specific project when costs are available and details regarding how this will benefit our local residents have been included.

The procession will leave Southwater Square at 10.20am. We will be joined by the KSLI and Uniformed Personnel. It will be good to have Scouts and Guides in attendance and Randlay Primary and Hollinswood Primary Schools.

There will be a period of reflection, included in the service, for people to remember anyone affected in any way by the Covid pandemic.

#### a) Community Fridge Project

Councillor Turley updated Members on the opening of the Community Fridge on 14<sup>th</sup> September at Randlay Community Centre. The Parish Council collects food from Telford Foodshare on a Tuesday and Thursday and the fridge is open from 10am until 11.30am both days. There is a suggested donation of £1 per family member, however this is only a suggestion. Items differ each week and local residents are invited to support this valuable project which also raises funds to help others. There are no eligibility criteria - everyone is welcome.

Surplus fresh fruit and vegetables can be available for jam / chutney making etc.

#### b) Downemead Youth Shelter

CCTV has been installed to oversee the area. The back panel of the shelter has been removed. Evidence of anti-social behaviour has reduced.

The structure will be painted and new signage added. We will also apply the non-drying paint to the roof.

The Chairman of the FoHRV and Glyn will be on site when the work is started. It was agreed to support FoHRV with this project.
