Council works with partners to progress stalled Randlay development site.

The site of the former shops and community buildings at Randlay remains undeveloped since a wider regeneration scheme which saw Telford and Wrekin Council work with Hollinswood and Randlay Parish Council to provide new shops and a new community centre. There was an original plan to build a care home, however the landowner has not been able to move forward with this scheme due to a lack of private funding. All the partners are committed to find a new development use for the site as quickly as possible and a number of possible options are now being considered. Councillor S Davies, Leader of TWC, said "We fully appreciate local concerns and we have taken steps to tidy it in the short term and we will keep people informed as matters progress".

Councillor Mrs Sheenagh Unwin, Chairman of HRPC, said "We welcome the commitment from Telford and Wrekin Council and the landowner/developer to progress as soon as possible, future development on the site and in the meantime, we appreciate their help to keep the site safer and tidier".
